(OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) (PAY AND DISPLAY, PAY ON FOOT AND PAY BY TELEPHONE) (VARIATION NO. 3 – WAPPING WHARF) ORDER 202-

The City Council of Bristol hereby gives NOTICE that it proposes to make a traffic order, the effect of which would be to vary the City Council of Bristol (Off-Street Parking Places) (Pay and Display, Pay on Foot and Pay by Telephone) Order 2012 (“the 2012 order”), as varied, so as to introduce a charge of £2.50 for a period of waiting of up to 1 hour, between the hours of 09.00 and 19.00 on the same day, in the **Wapping Wharf** short-stay off-street parking place, located on the quayside of Wapping Railway Wharf.

Introduction of this 1 hour charge period is proposed alongside the introduction of a revised charge structure previously due to come into operation on 7th August 2023 by virtue of the City Council of Bristol (Off-Street Parking Places) (Pay and Display, Pay on Foot and Pay by Telephone) (Variation No. 2) Order 2023 (“the 2023 Order”). However, implementation was delayed and the 2023 Order revisions have never been operational on-site. It is intended to address this anomaly and bring the 2023 Order revisions into force at the same time as this 1 hour charge.

This would give effect to the revised parking charges, days and hours of operation in **Wapping Wharf** off-street parking place as specified in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Notice. The charges, days and hours currently in operation **on-site** are as specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Notice.

Charges would apply to all vehicles permitted to use the off-street parking places pursuant to the 2012 Order except invalid carriages and disabled persons’ vehicles.

Existing provisions whereby any vehicle removed from Wapping Wharf off-street parking place between the hours of 08.00 and 20.00 Monday to Friday (excluding Bank Holidays) shall not be left again during those hours; and whereby a vehicle may wait in Wapping Wharf off-street parking place for so long as may be necessary to load/unload goods from the vehicle to adjacent properties or a moored vessel, would be retained.
