(CLIFTON VILLAGE AREA, CLIFTON, CLIFTON DOWN AND STOKE BISHOP WARDS, CITY OF BRISTOL) (RESIDENTS' PARKING AREA) (ON-STREET PARKING PLACES) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND STOPPING) ORDER 202-

The City Council of Bristol hereby gives NOTICE it proposes to make a traffic order, the effect of which would be:-

1. to introduce a parking place to be used at all times on the south side of **Princess Victoria Street**, opposite its junction with Waterloo Street, for the leaving of electric scooters and electrically assisted pedal cycles which are being hired as part of a scheme approved by the City Council;
2. to extend prohibition of waiting arrangements for vehicles in **Cecil Road**, north west side, replacing a length of existing Mon – Fri 9 am to 5 pm permit parking;
3. to revise prohibition of waiting arrangements for vehicles in **Pembroke Road** and **Princess Victoria Street**;
4. to introduce prohibition of loading/unloading for vehicles in **Princess Victoria Street**, both sides, between Regent Street and Waterloo Street;
5. to introduce a disabled persons' parking place in **West Mall**, north side, replacing a length of Mon to Sat 9 am to 9 pm shared use permit parking and/or (4 hours maximum stay) pay and display parking;
6. to introduce a disabled persons' parking place in **Royal Park**, north west side, replacing a length of Mon – Sat 9 am to 9 pm permit parking;
7. to revise Mon – Sat 9 am to 5 pm permit parking in **Pembroke Road**; and
8. to remove the disabled persons' parking place in **Westfield Place**, north side, and replace it with Mon – Sat 9 am to 9 pm permit parking.

The City Council of Bristol (Clifton Village Area, Clifton, Clifton Down and Stoke Bishop Wards, City of Bristol) (Residents' Parking Area) (On-Street Parking Places) (Prohibition of Waiting and Stopping) Order 2023 would be revoked and all other provisions therein brought forward unamended into the new order.
