(SPRINGFIELD AVENUE, AVONMOUTH & LAWRENCE WESTON WARD, CITY OF BRISTOL) (SCHOOL STREET PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) (ONE WAY TRAFFIC) ORDER 202-

The City Council of Bristol hereby gives NOTICE that it proposes to make a traffic order, the effect of which would be:-

1. to prohibit any vehicle from entering or proceeding in the northern spur of **Springfield Avenue** leading to Shirehampton Primary School between the hours of 8.15 a.m. and 9.15 a.m. and the hours of 2.30 p.m. and 3.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday. The closures would operate during Shirehampton Primary School term days only; and
2. to introduce eastbound one way traffic in **Springfield Avenue** from Portbury Grove to Burnham Road.

Exemption to the prohibition of entering or proceeding would be provided for pedal cycles, blue badge holders, for specified/statutory purposes and for permit holders. Permits would be available to eligible Springfield Avenue residents and their essential visitors, and where necessary access to Shirehampton Primary School is required. Exemption to the one way provisions would be provided for pedal cycles.
