(VARIOUS ROADS, SOUTHMEAD HOSPITAL AREA, BISHOPSTON AND ASHLEY DOWN, HORFIELD, SOUTHMEAD AND WESTBURY-ON-TRYM AND HENLEAZE WARDS, CITY OF BRISTOL) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) (CAR CLUB PARKING PLACES) ORDER 202-

The City Council of Bristol hereby gives NOTICE that it proposes to make a traffic order, the effect of which would be:-

- (a) to introduce prohibition of waiting arrangements for vehicles in lengths of **Broadway Avenue, Church Road, Churchways Avenue, Churchways Crescent, Hughenden Road, Laurie Crescent, Milton Road, Rosling Road, Rozel Road, Somerton Road, St. Leonards Road, Tennyson Road, Wellington Crescent, West Broadway, Western Road, Weston Crescent and Woodhouse Grove;**
- (b) to add additional lengths of prohibition of waiting for vehicles in **Kellaway Avenue, Kellaway Crescent, Wellington Drive, Wellington Hill and Wellington Hill West;**
- (c) to remove length of prohibition of waiting for vehicles in **Kelston Road;**
- (d) the City Council of Bristol (Various Roads, Southmead Hospital Area, Horfield, Southmead, and Westbury-on-Trym and Henleaze Wards, City of Bristol) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Car Club Parking Places) Order 2024 would be revoked and all provisions within that order brought forward unamended into the new order except for item (c) above; and
- (e) the City Council of Bristol (Wellington Hill, Horfield Ward, City of Bristol) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2023 would be revoked and its provision brought forward into the new order unamended.
